 - Continue east into New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

- Fuel is widely available; groceries are more affordable than in Europe
- Best season: May to October for mild weather and open parks; September-October for spectacular fall colors.

Can I do wild camping in Quebec and Eastern Canada?

Wild camping is limited and regulated. In Quebec, you'll find many official campgrounds in national and provincial parks. Overnight parking outside designated areas is generally not allowed, so it's best to use campgrounds or RV parks.

How long does it take to explore Quebec and the Gaspé Peninsula by RV?

A **2?week itinerary** is ideal to cover highlights such as Quebec City, Charlevoix, Saguenay Fjord, and the Gaspé Peninsula without rushing. Shorter loops (Eastern Townships, Charlevoix) can be done in under a week.

Are campgrounds in Quebec and Eastern Canada equipped for motorhomes?

Yes. Most campgrounds offer electricity, water, and dump stations. In national parks (Sépaq and Parks Canada), you'll also find modern facilities with showers and services adapted for RVs.
