Cowboys and rodeos first became a show and sporting event in the west of America. This legendary American culture is still very much alive in states such as **Nevada**, **Texas** and **Wyoming**. Some cities are well known as 'rodeo cities' and host regular festivals and competitions. In Nevada, **Reno** city organizes an annual rodeo festival every June, which brings together many rodeo champions. You can reach this city from **San Francisco**. The roads are well suited to motorhomes and offer easy driving conditions. You will also have no difficulty finding a campsite.

Not far from **Yellowstone National Park** and **Salt Lake City** in **Wyoming**, is the town of **Cody**. **Cody** is a rodeo town and home to Buffalo Bill, a famous, professional rodeo rider and buffalo hunter. There are three big shows during the summer in this town: **Cheyenne Frontier Days** in July, the famous **Buffalo Bill Cody Stampede Rodeo** which runs from June to August and the **Cody Nite Rodeo**. You can stay on a ranch in your motorhome at the **Ponderosa Ranch Campground** in Cody.

**Texas** also hosts many kinds of rodeo events. In the heart of **Fort Worth**, easily accessible from **Dallas**, you can attend a rodeo show at the **Cowton Colliseum** or the **Stockyards Championship Rodeo**.
